Nancee Blum, is a social work specialist, adjunct clinical faculty member, and researcher in the Department of Psychiatry, at the University of Iowa Carver College of Medicine. She has been co-investigator and director of a 4-year, NIMH funded research grant on Borderline Personality Disorder, and currently serves as a consultant and provides training in the Iowa Department of Correction to implement the STEPPS program in the Iowa prisons. She is also an Adjunct Instructor in the College of Medicine, College of Nursing, and School of Social Work, and is a Fellow of the American Psychotherapy Association. Ms. Blum was a medical editor and writer for many years prior to receiving her MSW. She is co-author of the Structured Interview for DSM-IV Personality (with Bruce Pfohl and Mark Zimmerman, American Psychiatric Press), and STEPPS Group Treatment Program for Borderline Personality Disorder (with Norm Bartels, Don St. John, and Bruce Pfohl), as well as author or co-author of numerous journal articles and book chapters. She is a member of the Scientific Advisory Board of the Treatment and Research Advancements Association for Personality Disorder and a member of the board of the Association for Research on Personality Disorders. Ms. Blum presents numerous training workshops on psychiatric topics both nationally and internationally.
